#### Farm Safety Issues

Seventeen percent of all farm injuries involve animals. The National Safety Council recorded beef cattle farms second and dairy farms third for injuries per hours worked when comparing all farming operations. Yet, young people do not view livestock dangerous. However, animals cause numerous fatalities and injures each year. When working with livestock, precautions are necessary. Size differences between large animals and a small person, an animal's unpredictability, and youth's lack of knowledge or skill can put young people at risk.

Safety suggestions for adults to share with young people working around animals:

- be calm, move slowly, and avoid loud noises
- wear closed-toed shoes

- avoid the hind legs of the animal
- approach large animals at the shoulder

## **CHARACTERCOUNTS!**

#### Trust Must Be Earned and Protected

"In every organization I work with, people talk freely and frequently about the importance of trust as a crucial...asset. No one seems to doubt how important it is to...personal relationships, and everyone seems aware of the tremendous costs of distrust. Yet despite enlightened (talk) about trust, many people...regularly engage in conduct that undermines it and damages credibility. It's really simple: To be trusted, one has to be perceived as being trustworthy. That means being scrupulously honest even on little things, and especially when one may have to pay a high price. Trustworthiness is more than telling the truth. It requires conveying the truth. Deception through clever wording or half-truths is essentially dishonest. Individuals...that care about building and retaining trust don't rely on...loopholes (in rules) or take refuge in the fact that "you never asked." People worthy of our trust are forthright and candid as well as truthful. They tell us what they know we want to know, even if it's not in their self-interest. Thus, being trustworthy involves a complex trio of concepts: truthfulness, non-deception, and candor, all aspects of honesty. It also requires integrity, promise-keeping, and loyalty. We trust people who put principles above profit and have the courage of their convictions. We don't trust those who look for and find exceptions and special circumstances that justify dishonesty. Trust isn't attained by wishing and wanting. It must be earned by actions. And after it has been earned, it must be continually protected. Remember, even a little lie can raise the question: "What else have you lied to me about?" Michael Josephson, February 9, 2009.

# **KANSAS STATE FAIR**

#### "9 in '09" -- Age of Exhibitors at the Kansas State Fair

What is currently happening.... As announced in previous communications, 4-H members who are 9 years of the age before January 1, 2009 will be allowed to exhibit at the 2009 Kansas State Fair. Each competitive event was subject to review by the respective Action Team and Extension Staff responsible for competitive events at the State Fair. Please check the State Fair Book for specifics (i.e., the age of the exhibitor did not change for the State Fashion Revue). This change in policy was based upon a review of research in the field of youth development and recommended by the State 4-H Advisory Committee.

A bit of background information....To further study the implications of this change for all other state-level competitive events, a "9 in '09" Think Tank was formed to address the specific challenges and opportunities. They identified a variety of county/district-level competitive events and activities that could be impacted by the change in age. They proposed several strategies for consideration by Extension Staff, using a blog survey tool. A 6-week window of time was allowed for feedback from agents after visiting with their 4-H PDC members, 4-H Council and other key partners to determine the best option for their local program. The availability of resources was to have been taken into consideration in making their recommendations, with resources including staff time, volunteers, funding, awards, event schedules and flexibility in forming classes/groups. Of utmost importance in the decision making process was designing age appropriate learning experiences in a safe environment.

Upon a review of the survey responses, the Think Tank:

- 1) Determined that age appropriate learning experiences were very important in order for youth to have a positive experience which would challenge and encourage them to continue their 4-H membership. They determined that the skill set, knowledge and maturity of a 9-year-old is vastly different than a 13-year-old.
- 2) Recommended that State Events follow the new age categories. Counties/Districts are encouraged to consider implementation at the local level as well:

Beginner 7-8 years of age, before January 1 (Cooperative learning at the state level (when offered; cooperative learning or

competition at the local level)

Junior 9-11 years of age, before January 1

Intermediate 12-13 years of age, before January 1

Senior 14 years of age and older, before January 1

3) Recognized that state level competitive events provide unique challenges with unique complexities, with no two events being the same, and that the respective Action Team or Event Committee determine the timeline for implementation of age categories for each respective event. The major categories of events include:

Judging Contests: Family and Consumer Sciences, Horse, Horticulture, Livestock, Meats, Crops and Photography

Quiz Bowls: Horse, Dairy and Livestock

Skillathon: Livestock

Shows: Horse, Dog, Dairy, Rabbit, and Poultry

Events: Horse Panorama, Shooting Sports Matches, Wheat Show, Fashion Revue and State Fair Demonstrations

#### What's next....

Action Teams and Event Committees will determine the "what, when and how" of the implementation of recommended age categories in the respective competitive event and communicate this information in a timely manner to the system.

OMK will provide the funds to pay rent of a facility, supplies for classes, snacks and lunch, and marketing of the camp. Host site is responsible for providing American Income Life Special Activities Insurance, camp counselors and help in planning the day. OMK has dollars available to fund 5 one-day Day camps.

\*Conduct a two-day, Day Camp (no overnight). OMK will provide funding and support for two-day long event with the themes of SET, Health, Environmental education, or Theater Arts. OMK will provide the funds to pay rent of a facility, supplies for classes, snacks and lunch, and marketing of the camp. Host site is responsible for providing American Income Life Special Activities Insurance, camp counselors and help in planning the two day event. OMK has dollars available to fund 4 two-day Day camps.
