## **Respect: Good Relationships Make a Good Life**

If we interviewed 100 happy people, I think the most prominent common denominator would be good relationships. Despite the widespread promotion of materialism and vanity in our culture, wealth and beauty are not enough to produce happiness. In fact, they're not even necessary. What's more, bad relationships – at work, at school, at home, or among friends – are a surefire source of anguish and heartache. For most of us, the connections that most strongly influence our level of happiness are family bonds. And the most powerful of all are at the inner core of family, especially parent-child relationships. No matter what your age, your kinship with your parents will always have a unique capacity to generate comfort or pain. Many children have ambivalent feelings about their folks. Yet most crave their approval, respect, and love. Parents have a similar need. If you're a parent, resolve to make more consistent and conscientious efforts to make your children feel appreciated. If you want to make their lives and yours happier, be careful not to demean or diminish their achievements, and avoid expressions of disappointment. Tell your child you're proud to have him or her as a son or daughter. And if you still can, give your parents pleasure by showing them you love them, not only for what they did for you as a child but for who they are now. Talk to them frequently and talk of meaningful things. Ask their advice, and don't roll your eyes in disdain if you disagree with it. One of the best ways to express your love is through respect. #### **April - Super Seed Fun**

April showers bring May flowers ... and temperatures are rising, therefore Springs must be coming soon! As you prepare for 4-H Cloverbuds take an opportunity to share nature and the beginning of the growing season. The 4-H Cloverbuds' Curriculum offers a lesson on Super Seed Fun. Check it out for ideas.

Objectives for 4-H Cloverbuds

Learn what seeds need to grow;

- Observe how seeds can travel;
- Learn about seeds we eat.

Life skill development for 4-H Cloverbuds:

- Social skill learned through working together;
- Decision making used by when working with their hands;
- Eye-hand coordination developed through using scissors;
- Large motor skills developed through participation in games.

Activities available for 4-H Cloverbuds:

1) "How Are They Alike"

- 2) "What Grows From Seeds"
- 3) "I'm A Little Seed Pod" (group singing)

4) "Seed Mosaic"
5) "How Do Seeds Travel"
6) "Sunshine and Rain Help Us Grow" Creative Movement

8) "Fruity Prints"
9) "A Sweet and Seedy Snack"
10) "An Alphabet Game"

A Sweet and Seedy Snack - Refreshment - an important part of 4-H Cloverbuds' activities.

Materials: Equal amounts of sunflower seeds (shelled), honey, peanut butter (double check 4-H Participation Form for food allergies) cocoa powder, one box of sesame seeds; bowl, spatula, wooden spoon, mixing cups, wax paper.

Make sure that the children wash their hand before making this yummy snack! Mix equal parts of all of the ingredients except the sesame seeds. Using your hands, roll into balls about one inch in diameter; place on the wax paper. Roll in sesame seeds and enjoy!

Application: Look at the grocery store for other examples of seeds we eat. Some are eaten whole like shelled sunflower seeds and sesame seeds. Other are ground up to use in cooking and baking. How many can you find?

## Tax Issues

IRS e-Postcard filing for 4-H Clubs and Affiliated 4-H Organizations that earn less than \$25,000. If your clubs and groups were submitted in 2008 by the State 4-H Office and your 2009 tax year for these groups ended 12/31/2009; then you must file your e-postcard BEFORE May 15, 2010!

Steps to file:

- 1. Go to <u>www.irs.gov/charities/</u>
- 2. Click on Form 990-N (e-postcard)
- 3. Click "Here" to file 990-N

- 4. Click button to leave IRS site (a private company handles things)
- 5. Register as New User as first step of a 3 step process [if you know your Login ID and password from last year, begin at Step 2 Create Form 990-N (e-postcard)]
- 6. Create a password
- 7. Receive an e-mail

Complete information page:

- \* Legal Name (should pop up as: 4-H Clubs Affiliated 4-H Organizations)
- \* When you get to Principal Officer -- Be sure to select "Person" DO NOT SELECT BUSINESS!!!!
- \* You can immediately check filing status and you should get an e-mail verification of acceptance.

NOTE: Make copies and document all efforts including failures! If you get a failure notice, it should provide directions as tohow to correct errors. I filed for Geology Action Team and everything went smoothly. Adams
