Access 4-H Enrollment

Please continue with your plans to make the transition to Access 4-H Enrollment by May 2011. We want to help staff make the switch prior to the rush of summer camping and county fairs/state fair and year-end reporting. End of year reporting for 2011 will only be accepted via Access 4-H; especially in light of all the troubles caused by Blue Ribbon and the K-State e-mail system.

The National Access 4-H Team offers weekly webinars hosted by Meredith Muckerman. You can sign up for these trainings at: <u>http://tinyurl.com/Access4-HTraining</u> You need to sign up no later than 12 PM Eastern on the day before the training to be able to receive e-mail confirmation and instructions.

We plan to continue offering face-to-face training sessions here in Kansas along with Adobe Connect webinars and downloadable training videos.

Over the next several months Access 4-H is planning some significant new features and upgrades they are labeling "Access 4-H 2.0". Below is a list of anticipated questions and responses.

1. Will it replace the current ACCESS 4-H Online Enrollment System and when can we expect it?

Access 2.0 will be an incremental extension of the current enrollment system as opposed to a replacement. Users will see these incremental updates and new features between now and July 31st 2011, when ACCESS 2.0 is slated to be finalized. ACCESS 2.0 is focused on functionality beyond base enrollment and data management.

2. Will staff have to be retrained for ACCESS 2.0?

There will not be a massive overhaul or need for current users to re-learn system use. All base functionality will remain the same.

3. What will ACCESS 2.0 offer and what is the anticipated release timeline?

Along with many improvements to and enhancements of current functionality, here are some of the new features ACCESS 2.0 will offer;

·Internationalization (Summer 2011)

·Calendaring (State/County/Club levels) (Summer 2011)

Youth Livestock Safety Video Available

A new dvd "Youth Livestock Safety" from the K-State Extension Farm Safety program is now available through the Extension Bookstore, Video #582. One copy of the dvd is being distributed to each Kansas Extension office. Additional dvds can be ordered from the Bookstore for the cost of postage while supplies last. The current inventory is 1,900. The safety lessons were designed to supplement 4-H and youth livestock curriculum materials for use at project meetings. The material on the dvd is supplemented with web-based safety lessons at: <u>http://ylsp.bae.ksu.edu</u>. The project was funded by a USDA-NIFA Youth Farm Safety Grant.

Video and print safety lessons cover commonly-shown livestock species -- beef, dairy, horse, sheep, swine, and goat. The dvd also includes supplemental material on making livestock projects safe and accessible for youth with disabilities. Web site content is taken from the dvds. Video lessons are closed captioned.

Animals are one of the top three cause agents and a leading source of non-machinery injury to youth in an agricultural setting. The National Children's Center for Rural and Agricultural Health reports 52% of injuries to all farm youth occur on livestock operations. Because of the amount of time spent with their animals, youth who raise and show livestock may be at greater risk of injury. The video was produced in Kansas with Kansas 4-H members, families, and shows. Some of you will recognize 4-H families from your counties; others of you allowed us to film at fairs and other livestock events in your counties. Thank you to all who helped with this project.

All women participate in determining house rules and electing officers. House duties are distributed among members and arranged around class schedules. This cooperative effort allows Clovia to be an economical living situation. Members pay about \$1,500 each semester, which includes 18 meals/week, laundry, internet, and utilities. A semester in the residence halls with 20 meals/week is around \$3,500. The average cost of living in a sorority for a semester is over \$2,600.

Clovia is a home away from home. Since all Clovia girls share similar backgrounds and interests, moving into Clovia is like gaining instant friends. The girls are all ready to help new members get adjusted to living away from home and find their way around campus and Manhattan. To be eligible for new membership, a girl must have been an active member of 4-H or have a similiar background. If the prospective member is a high school senior, she must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0. Clovia strives to find new members who have a positive attitude, a good academic record, and good leadership skills. Kansas Foster Care Resource Family Grants

Kansas 4-H Youth Development, the Kansas 4-H Foundation and Saint Francis Community Services are working together to provide funding opportunities for foster children.

The purpose of the Kansas 4-H Resource Family Project and Camp Grant Programs is to provide financial assistance for foster youth and their resource families who want to participate in learning opportunities available through 4-H. Kansas 4-H is open to all youth ages 7 through 18 wanting to expand their learning opportunities. 4-H focuses on developing confident, capable, caring, responsible citizens. 4-H offers a wide range of project areas that youth may learn from, ranging from agriculture to food and nutrition to aerospace and photography. Although being involved in the local club can provide an opportunity for youth to learn from each other and contribute to others through community service projects, volunteers and family support are also important elements of 4-H as volunteers and parents serve as club and project leaders that guide and mentor youth.

Family Project Grants

- o Foster children must enroll as 4-H members through their local extension office
- o Eligible 4-H member can only apply for one 4-H project and one 4-H camp grant per year.
- o Grant funds are for the purpose of starting or enhancing a 4-H project during the 4-H year such as purchasing a camera, craft supplies, clothing, feed, equipment, etc.
- o Eligible 4-H member may request funds for supplies and equipment needed for participating in a pet or livestock project; however, funds are not available for the purchase of pets or livestock.
- o Grant funding cannot include meal expenses.
- o Items and supplies purchased from grant funding for 4-H project become the property of the eligible 4-H member.
- o Liability, maintenance and warranty of the items and supplies purchased become the responsibility of the eligible 4-H member.

2011 Camp Payment Process

Administrators have agreed on the following for 2011 Camp payments: **KSRE Rock Springs Camp Payment**

- 1. By February 1, the camp chair will submit to Rock Spring a list of extension units and whether to invoice the 4-H Council or Extension Council.
- 2. Two weeks prior to camp, the camp chair notifies the assigned Rock Springs Administrator on Duty of individual extension units' numbers of campers, counselors and agents/adults. (Scenic County: 112 campers, 15 counselors, 4 agents/adults for counselor training and 12 additional agents/adults). Plus, provide Rock Springs with the number of campers housed in the Stonybrook living area.
- 3. Upon receiving the number of campers by extension unit from the camp chair, Rock Springs will invoice individual extension units within the camp group.
- 4. Rock Springs will adjust for available discounts based on camper numbers and Stonybrook campers.
- 5. Individual extension units will pay Rock Springs prior to the start of camp.
- 6. During 4-H camp, financial changes will be adjusted as needed. Additional fees must be submitted within two weeks following camp participation.

Extension 4-H Camp Incidental Fees

- 1. Camp groups' financial account managed within either an extension unit's 4-H Council or Extension Council as a sub-account.
 - a. Extension unit manages the account under KSRE recommendations.
 - b. Preference of KSRE Administration would be individual agents/adult volunteers purchase needed supplies/equipment on personal account and submit expenses to camp group treasurer for reimbursement.
 - c. All financial transactions must be accounted for.

CHARACTER COUNTS! Cheating Is Just Wrong

A recent study by the Josephson Institute reveals that 59% of high schoolers admit they cheated in the past year. Yet neither schools nor parents seem to take this seriously. Instead they often tell kids: "You're only cheating yourself." Not a good thing to say. First, it's not true. Cheaters don't only cheat themselves. They cheat fellow students who earn their grades fairly, and they cheat everyone who is misled by a fraudulently acquired grade. Most of all, cheaters dishonor themselves, their families, teachers, and schools. Telling a youngster "you're only cheating yourself" transforms an issue of integrity and moral responsibility into a self-serving cost/benefit calculation that doesn't favor a decision to not cheat. Most kids know that they could live successful and happy lives even if they never learn the value of X or capital of Zimbabwe. What's more, a strong argument could be made that learning to cheat could be more useful than learning to study. Trying to instill a commitment to honesty by appealing to self-interest reinforces the corrosive idea that decisions should be made on the basis of personal advantage rather than moral duty. We should tell children that cheating is wrong because it is dishonest

and unfair. We should tell them that the road to a worthy and fulfilling life filled with meaningful relationships is the road of honor, not expediency. We should teach them to do what is right, not because of what they will get from it, but because of what they will become by it. (Josephson, Michael. 22 February 2011) **Gerhard**

Do Your 4-H Clubs/Groups Need to Report 2010 Income to IRS? Now is the time to check!

Tax time is upon us and 4-H National Headquarters has shared some important information to help 4-H Clubs/Groups determine whether they need to file with the IRS by May 15, 2011 (Yes, May!).

- In the next few days, each Extension Unit will receive an e-mail from Keli Yungeberg, the State 4-H Office Manager, with a listing of all of the 4-H clubs/groups/affiliates (except local 4-H Foundations/Funds with separate 501(c)3 status) in your Extension Unit. Please carefully check this list for 4-H clubs/groups that are missing and must be added or should be deleted because they have disbanded. [Please include your newest 4-H clubs/groups.] Please check the EIN numbers for accuracy, too. Please complete this task NO LATER THAN FRIDAY, APRIL 1! (and that's not "foolin" around). The e-mail will include the necessary forms and instructions if you have a 4-H club/group that does not have an EIN. If you do not want to e-mail your changes, you may call Keli Yungeberg (785-532-5800) or fax the information in care of Keli to (785-532-5981). KSRE must submit the most current and accurate list of Kansas 4-H clubs/groups to the IRS.
- 2) Tell the 4-H clubs/groups in your Extension Unit to check whether they must report their 2010 income to the IRS. The minimum annual gross income for reporting for 501(c)3 charitable organizations has been increased from \$25,000 (2009 and earlier) to \$50,000 in 2010. This means, that if a 4-H club/group has earned gross income less than \$50,000 between January 1-December 31, 2010, THEY DO NOT NEED TO FILE! The IRS frequently automatically sends filing information to groups that have filed in previous years. Even if you receive such a courtesy mailing, follow the rule stated above! If any 4-H club/group's gross receipts are equal to or greater than \$50,000, they should consult a local tax preparer regarding proper filing of their IRS Form 990.
