Vibrant Video Clip Making Training

Introduction: Kansas 4-H has been awarded a grant from the Kansas 4-H Foundation to teach the skills needed to make vibrant video clips to support the Kansas 4-H Program. Deryl Waldren and Rod Buchele, Area 4-H Specialists in the Northwest and Southwest Areas, respectively will head up this training that the grant will provide. Please reserve these dates on your calendar – February 9-11, 2010, Rock Springs 4-H Center. We'll plan to start early afternoon on the first day and end before noon on the third day. We will be using the "Terrapod" curriculum and will be bringing in trainers from Montana State to teach the hands-on video-making skills to up to 30 individuals. The Kansas 4-H on-line registration system will be used, and will go live in early December. If you are thinking about attending, please contact Rod at rbuchele@ksu.edu or Deryl at dwaldren@ksu.edu for guestions about how this training will be conducted.

Background: Kansas 4-H is not unique in the challenges that the 4-H program across America faces in the 21st Century. The challenges that youth and adults face today are more complex than ever before. For most, life has become a bombardment of daily communication stimuli that are expected and perceived essential: cell phones, social networking, (myspace, facebook and more), instant messaging, ipods, podcasting, vodcasting (video podcasating), computers, texting, television, twittering, video gaming, You Tube, digital cameras, internet use, e-mailing, to mention but a few.

We know that each generation learns differently and is motivated differently. Baby Boomers are more likely to prefer print, talking face-to-face or communicating by telephone to stay connected at work and with families. Generation Xers and Millennials generally prefer using their computers, and other affiliated electronic media to stay connected at work and with families. It's a given today that youth expect and rely on the computers, television, and other affiliated electronic media to function on a daily basis. This creates a unique challenge in how Kansas 4-H in the future will teach its 4-H members, and will train and utilize its volunteer leader base and Extension staff. At present, most 4-H materials exist as static print-only.

Focus: The target audience is teen and adult volunteers and Extension staff. The training will teach teen and adult volunteers and staff in the developing and making of hands-on, experiential, dynamic, shorter length (3-5 minute) lower tech, mid-quality video clips that will be uploaded to the Kansas 4-H website to meet 21st Century program, project, club and training needs of Kansas 4-H. These trained teen and adult volunteers and staff will then teach video-making skills to 4-H youth. An additional outcome will be the creation of an increasing number of short and subject-matter 4-H Science-based, civic-science based, strengthening club resources, 4-H project and/or 4-H marketing/promotional video clips for use in Kansas 4-H. Kansas Foster Care Resource Family Grants

Kansas 4-H Youth Development, the Kansas 4-H Foundation and Saint Francis Community Services are working together to provide funding opportunities for children and families involved with foster care. The purpose of the Kansas 4-H Resource Family Project and Camp Grant Programs is to provide financial assistance for foster youth and their resource families who want to participate in learning opportunities available through 4-H. Kansas 4-H is open to all youth ages 7 through 18 wanting to expand their learning opportunities. 4-H focuses on developing confident, capable, caring, responsible citizens. 4-H offers a wide range of project areas that youth may learn from, ranging from agriculture to food and nutrition to aerospace and photography. Although being involved in the local club can provide an opportunity for youth to learn from each other and contribute to others through community service projects, volunteers and family support are also important elements of 4-H as volunteers and parents serve as club and project leaders that guide and mentor youth.

Through the Kansas 4-H Foundation, \$5,000 of grant funds are available to support resource families and the children in their care who are current or potential 4-H members.

Family Project Grants

- · Children must enroll as 4-H members through their local extension office.
- Eligible 4-H member can only apply for one 4-H project and one 4-H camp grant per year.
- Grant funds are for the purpose of starting or enhancing a 4-H project during the 4-H year such as purchasing a camera, craft supplies, clothing, feed, equipment, etc.
- Eligible 4-H member may request funds for supplies and equipment needed for participating in a pet or livestock project; however, funds are not available for the purchase of pets or livestock.
- Grant funding can not include meal expenses.
- · Items and supplies purchased from grant funding for 4-H project become the property of the eligible 4-H member.
- Liability, maintenance and warranty of the items and supplies purchased become the responsibility of the eligible 4-H member.

activities it's not for very long - probably 10 - 15 minutes tops! So when planning 4-H Cloverbuds activities let's review and determine if it's age appropriate.

Activity	Age Appropriate
Singing/Action Songs	Yes - 5- and 6-year olds enjoy silly songs and like physical movement especially gross muscles.
Serving as a 4-H Club officer	No - as 5- and 6-years are concert thinkers and giving directions can be a challenging abstract thought process.
Caring for Pets	Yes - learning to care for pets by feeding and watering, however 5- and 6-year olds cannot be totally responsible as they can forget.
Square Dancing	No - most 5- and 6-year old can tell their own left and right, however following a square dance calling and knowing others left and right are difficult tasks.
Hugs	Yes - 5- and 6-year olds seek adult approval and will easily hug others.
