Kansas Foster Care Resource Family Grants

Kansas 4-H Youth Development, the Kansas 4-H Foundation and Saint Francis Community Services are working together to provide funding opportunities for children and families involved with foster care.

The purpose of the Kansas 4-H Resource Family Project and Camp Grant Programs is to provide financial assistance for foster youth and their resource families who want to participate in learning opportunities available through 4-H. Kansas 4-H is open to all youth ages 7 through 18 wanting to expand their learning opportunities. 4-H focuses on developing confident, capable, caring, responsible citizens. 4-H offers a wide range of project areas that youth may learn from, ranging from agriculture to food and nutrition to aerospace and photography. Although being involved in the local club can provide an opportunity for youth to learn from each other and contribute to others through community service projects, volunteers and family support are also important elements of 4-H as volunteers and parents serve as club and project leaders that guide and mentor youth.

Through the Kansas 4-H Foundation, \$5,000 of grant funds are available to support resource families and the children in their care who are current or potential 4-H members.

Family Project Grants

- · Children must enroll as 4-H members through their local extension office.
- · Eligible 4-H member can only apply for one 4-H project and one 4-H camp grant per year.
- · Grant funds are for the purpose of starting or enhancing a 4-H project during the 4-H year such as purchasing a camera, craft supplies, clothing, feed, equipment, etc.
- · Eligible 4-H member may request funds for supplies and equipment needed for participating in a pet or livestock project; however, funds are not available for the purchase of pets or livestock.
- · Grant funding can not include meal expenses.
- · Items and supplies purchased from grant funding for 4-H project become the property of the eligible 4-H member.
- · Liability, maintenance and warranty of the items and supplies purchased become the responsibility of the eligible 4-H member.

CHARACTER COUNTS! Let the Butterfly Struggle

There's a parable about a mother who discovered a butterfly struggling mightily to escape its cocoon through a tiny opening at the top. She became concerned when the creature seemed to give up after making no progress.

Certain that the butterfly wouldn't make it out without help, she enlarged the hole. On its next try, the butterfly wriggled out easily. But the young woman's joy turned to horror when she saw its wings were shriveled and useless. Her well-intentioned intervention had interrupted a natural process. Forcing the butterfly to squeeze though a small opening is nature's way of assuring that blood from the creature's body is pushed into the wings. By making it easier, she deprived the butterfly of strong wings. Childhood, too, is a sort of cocoon. If a healthy adult is to emerge, parents must allow, even encourage, their children to struggle, make mistakes, learn from them, and pay the price for bad judgments and conduct.

Of course, good parents should protect their children from serious harm, but being overprotective can itself inflict damage. Adversity is not always an enemy. Teaching can help a young person develop wings strengthened by self-confidence and self-reliance. Helen Keller once said, "Character cannot be developed in ease and quiet. Only through experience of trial and suffering can the soul be strengthened, vision cleared, ambition inspired, and success achieved."

Activity	Age Appropriate
Singing/Action Songs	Yes - 5- and 6-year olds enjoy silly songs and like physical movement especially gross muscles.
Serving as a 4-H Club offier	No - as 5- and 6-years are concern thinkers and giving directions can be a challenging abstract thought process
Caring for Pets	Yes - learning to care for pets by feeding and watering, however 5- and 6-year olds cannot be totally responsible as they can forget
Square Dancing	No - most 5- and 6-year olds can tell their own left and right, however following a square dance calling and knowing others left and right are difficult talks.
Hugs	Yes - 5- and 6-year olds seek adult approval and will easily hug others.

GeoTech Community Service Learning Program Launched

The GeoTech Community Service Learning program has been launched! Leaders from ten communities recently completed an intensive, hands-on GPS-GIS training experience at the Rock Springs 4-H Center. Over the next seven months they will facilitate youth in identifying local needs, collecting related attribute data and creating digital GIS maps that will result in a GIS service learning project. Youth will present their geospatial work to stakeholders to increase awareness and potentially serve as a catalyst for community improvement.

Pilot communities include: Atchison (Nielson/Flynn), Douglas (Abel-Ruch), Harvey (Religa/Schurter), Labette (Martin), Linn (Purkeypile), Meadowlark District (Feldkamp), Pratt County/Pratt High School (Aramowicz/Sharp), Flint Hill District (Waymire), Sunflower District (Elfers), and Walnut Creek District (Harmon/Payne).
