County Fair Most Visible Time to Market 4-H

4-H Marketing Action Team members recently talked to families who aren't in 4-H, in hopes of learning how to better recruit them into the program. Our findings were alarming :

- They truly believed that a 4-H member must have acreage and animals
- They had no clue how to get involved

As a result, we're re-crafting our message and materials so that all families and children in your local community feel like they, too, can be a part of one of the most valuable youth programs around.

The County Fair is the time when 4-H is most visible to the public, and we want to use this opportunity to get the right word out about our program:

- 4-H is the network of families that grows great kids
 - 4-H is for city/town families, too

We need your help in telling this story, and there are several things you can do:

Also, in early June, the new USDA "ChooseMyPlate.gov" graphic for our nation's dietary guidelines was revealed. The new ChooseMyPlate.gov guidance for healthy eating includes:

Enjoy your food, but eat less

- · Avoid oversized portions
- Make half your plate fruits and vegetables
- \cdot Switch to fat-free or low-fat (1%) milk
- · Make at least half your grains whole grains
- \cdot Compare sodium in foods like soup, bread, and frozen meals, and choose food with lower numbers
- · Drink water instead of sugar details.

Positive Youth Development

Parent Dilemma – social media independence vs. social media risk

A proposed legislative bill in California would give parents legal right to see their childrens facebook accounts .The bill is called California SB 242, and if a child under the age of 18 signs up for Facebook, or any social network, that child will have to give their parents access to view their account. Also, any account of a child that is under age, the privacy level will be set to the maximum level so that other people cannot view their profiles. Some may consider this sort of legislation extreme, but it does illustrate the dilemma parents often have when they want their children to learn independence, but they also want their children to be safe online and on-text.

According to the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) in their April 2011 journal, benefits of children and adolescents using social media include:

- · Opportunities for community engagement
- · Enhancement of individual and collective creativity
- · Growth ideas from the creation of social media products (e.g., blogs)
- · Expansion of one's online connections through shared interests
- · Fostering one's individual identity and social skills.

However, social media "becomes a risk to adolescents more often than most adults realize," (AAP, pg. 801). Not only is cyberbullying and loss of privacy risks associated with social media, but "Facebook depression", defined as depression that develops when preteens and teens spend a great deal of time on social media sites and then begin to exhibit classic symptoms of depression.

Acceptance by and contact with peers is important to adolescents. The intensity of being online can trigger depression when the teen begins to believe that they are socially at-risk (e.g., loss of Facebook "friends") or are socially shunned (e.g., being de-Friended). AAP recommends that parents talk to their children about these very real risks, that parents supervise online activities and use of devices, and that parents become better educated about the technologies their children are exposed to at home, in school and in neighborhoods.
