### Hosts Needed for Taiwan 4-H Professional Exchange

Taiwan 4-H, a 4-H program inspired by U. S. 4-H more than fifty years ago, is alive and well and working to keep its program meeting the needs of Taiwan citizens. Under new leadership for the last two years, the program has looked to Kansas 4-H to supply new ideas through the exchange of professionals and volunteer leaders. We have hosted one professional and two young adult leaders in 2007 and 2008. They have been most enthusiastic about learning from 4-H camps, activities and fairs. Their hosts have found them to have English skills and delightful to host.

In 2009 Taiwan 4-H has made a special request that Kansas host a young man on the national staff and a volunteer leader. I have met him and worked with him in organizing the exchanges. He promises to be an avid learner. The Taiwan 4-H Director would especially like to have the national staff member hosted by an Extension agent who works with 4-H. Would you consider this experience? He can be housed by the agent or by a local family if the agent(s) will spend time with him helping him learn about the program and what's involved in administering it. We are also seeking hosts for a volunteer leader too, who will likely be a college student who is active with 4-H. We have requested a female. We would expect that she also will want to be included in local 4-H activities. They will arrive in Kansas June 22 and depart about August 1 or 2. We would like to place them with three hosts each (for about two weeks per host). ### Opportunities to Host Teens from Costa Rica, Finland and Norway

Kansas 4-H works through the States' 4-H International Exchange Programs (S4-HIEP), a collaboration of the states that participate in exchanges for 4-H teens, to offer two way exchanges with Costa Rica, Finland, Japan and Norway. Except for Japan the host family placements are made directly by the S4-HIEP program managers, WorldWise Exchange in Seattle. Applications are secured and families screened here in Kansas, so we try to secure applications a couple of weeks prior to their **March 1 application deadline**. It is probably possible to be considered as host for a teen (15-18) from Costa Rica, Finland or Norway or a chaperone from one of those countries until mid March if all have not been placed. Host families for teens should have a teen of the same gender and approximate age as the incoming teen. The teens stay with one family for four weeks between mid June and the end of July. The Norwegians come around the first of July and they would like to participate in 4-H camp which would be a limiting factor. How about it Far Points counties?
