# CHARACTERCOUNTS!

### **Respect Means Knowing When to Back Off**

I've talked before about the ethical obligation to treat others with respect by attentive listening. Today, I want to talk about the flip side of respect: the duty to back off and accept the fact that while others should listen to us, we can't demand that they agree with us. Such unreasonable demands are especially prevalent when someone in authority (boss or parent) lectures, criticizes, sermonizes, or berates an employee or child well past the point of legitimate communication. But it isn't just people of authority who seek to impose their ideas through bulldozer tactics. The common thread in disrespectful communication is going beyond reasonable attempts to inform or persuade. At that point it becomes a harangue. It's as if the speaker's trying to beat us into submission rather than simply conveying a point of view, pummeling us with repetitive opinions, complaints, or demands. And if we don't give the desired response, the speaker restates the point louder or more aggressively. Telling browbeaters that we understand their position and will consider what they said rarely stops the onslaught because the only way they'll believe we understand their point is if we agree with it. They can become so self-righteous that they think disagreeing with them is proof of confusion, ignorance, stupidity, or a closed mind. No one has the right to impose his or her opinions on others or to demand to be listened to until he or she is done. The moral obligation of respect requires that we learn when to back off and that we learn when to listen. (Michael Josephson, January 29, 2010) GERHARD

Tax Issues

IRS e-Postcard filing for 4-H Clubs and Affiliated 4-H Organizations that earn less than \$25,000. If your clubs and groups were submitted in 2008 by the State 4-H Office and your 2009 tax year for these groups ended 12/31/2009; then you must file your e-postcard BEFORE May 15, 2010!

Steps to file:

1. Go to <u>www.irs.gov/charities/</u>

- 2. Click on Form 990-N (e-postcard)
- 3. Click "Here" to file 990-N
- 4. Click button to leave IRS site (a private company handles things)

5. Register as New User as first step of a 3 step process [if you know your Login ID and

password from last year, begin at Step 2 - Create Form 990-N (e-postcard)]

- 6. Create a password
- 7. Receive an e-mail

Complete information page:

\* Legal Name (should pop up as: 4-H Clubs Affiliated 4-H Organizations)

\* When you get to Principal Officer -- Be sure to select "Person" DO NOT SELECT BUSINESS!!!!

\* You can immediately check filing status and you should get an e-mail verification of acceptance.

NOTE: Make copies and document all efforts including failures! If you get a failure notice, it should provide directions as tohow to correct errors. I filed for Geology Action Team and everything went smoothly. Adams

### Host Families Needed for Summer and Fall International Exchanges

Please help put the word out that Kansas 4-H will be hosting a larger than usual number of international exchangees this year. The bios we have look like a super exchangees who should be fun to host. We're glad that our reputation as having good hosting experiences is getting around. This means we need to expand the network and involve new host families. If families are doing less traveling during the recession, this is a way they can provide their families a fun and educational experience at low cost. Our exchanges this summer will involve hosting an individual from a 4-H partner organization for just 2-4 weeks per family.

Do you know 4-H'ers who are studying Spanish and would like to host a **teen from Costa Rica**? We need their applications completed very quickly as they must be

submitted to Seattle with references and In Home Interview completed by March 1. Got and idea, send them an e-mail or give a call. They must have a family sibling within two years of the Costa Rican (ages 15-18) and will host one month from June 20 to July 17.

The following counties/districts will be hosting **Japanese**: Butler, Central Kansas, Finney, Phillips-Rooks, and River Valley. Families in or near those locations may be able to host a young teen (average ages 12-13) for 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> weeks July 22-August 18. Contact the host agent or Rose Scott <u>rose@threeriversinc.org</u> if there is interest.

Beginning June 21 Ka nsas expects to be hosting three International 4-H Youth Exchange (IFYE) delegates. One is a **Landjugend member from Switzerland** who grew up on a dairy and grain farm and has done apprenticeships in carpentry and agriculture. He plans to take over the family farm when he returns. **Matthias is 23** and likes outdoor activities (snowboarding and hiking), nice cars and being with friends. He hopes to get ideas from American farms he can use back home. He rates his English good. He will leave in early September.

Also June 21 we expect two (probably one male and one female) **Taiwanese 4-H representatives** who could be staff or volunteers on a professional exchange. They want to experience a variety of 4-H projects, activities and events. We hope to get details on our 2010 exchangees soon. Several agents have hosted Taiwanese and report great experiences. The Taiwanese will have three families of about two weeks each. They will depart around the end of July.

In July **Christine age 19** will arrive from Austria for a six-week stay. We will assign two to three families during the July-Ausgust period. She is a Landjugend member in her home country and grew up on a dairy, grain and hay farm. She lists Landjugend activities as one hobby and snowboarding, cycling, friends, travel, reading and agriculture as others. Christine reports her native German is excellent while English and Spanish are both good, but she would like to improve her English, learn about our culture, political system and economics. She is still deciding on a career.

**Caroline**, our second **Swiss**, **age 19** will arrive in mid September following a threemonth stay with Colorado families. She is working on improving English so she can work in the hospitality industry. She speaks French at home and reports excellent German, while English are good. Her hobbies are sports, listening to music, reading and languages. She says she joyful and curious and hopes for families with children. She will need 4-5 hosts.

Kansas 4-H will be hosting two **Swedish 4H exchangees**, probably beginning in September. They would each need multiple families. Both are girls, but details about their stay are not yet known.

Kansas has been asked also to host a **German** exchangee Lena, 23, in the late fall to winter period who can't depart Germany until September. She would like six months in Colorado and Kansas. She graduates in horticulture in September and plans to go on for a Masters. She has a farm background and is willing to help on a farm. Kansas may be sharing a three month hosting term with Colorado between September and December.
