Alpha of Clovia 4-H based Scholarship House Opportunity for Women

Alpha of Clovia is a 4-H based scholarship house for women near the Kansas State University campus. Clovia is a house ran for the women and by the women. All women participate in determining house rules and electing officers. House duties are distributed among members and arranged around class schedules. This cooperative effort allows Clovia to be an economical living situation. Members pay about \$1,500 each semester, which includes 18 meals/week, laundry, internet, and utilities. A semester in the residence halls with 20 meals/week is around \$3,500. The average cost of living in a sorority for a semester is over \$2,600.

Clovia is a home away from home. Since all Clovia girls share similar backgrounds and interests, moving into Clovia is like gaining instant friends. The girls are all ready to help new members get adjusted to living away from home and find their way around campus and Manhattan. To be eligible for new membership, a girl must have been an active member of 4-H or have a similiar background. If the prospective member is a high school senior, she must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0. Clovia strives to find new members who have a positive attitude, a good academic record, and good leadership skills. Kansas Foster Care Resource Family Grants

Kansas 4-H Youth Development, the Kansas 4-H Foundation and Saint Francis Community Services are working together to provide funding opportunities for children and families involved with foster care.

The purpose of the Kansas 4-H Resource Family Project and Camp Grant Programs is to provide financial assistance for foster youth and their resource families who want to participate in learning opportunities available through 4-H. Kansas 4-H is open to all youth ages 7 through 18 wanting to expand their learning opportunities. 4-H focuses on developing confident, capable, caring, responsible citizens. 4-H offers a wide range of project areas that youth may learn from, ranging from agriculture to food and nutrition to aerospace and photography. Although being involved in the local club can provide an opportunity for youth to learn from each other and contribute to others through community service projects, volunteers and family support are also important elements of 4-H as volunteers and parents serve as club and project leaders that guide and mentor youth.

Family Project Grants

- o Children must enroll as 4-H members through their local extension office
- o Eligible 4-H member can only apply for one 4-H project and one 4-H camp grant per year.
- o Grant funds are for the purpose of starting or enhancing a 4-H project during the 4-H year such as purchasing a camera, craft supplies, clothing, feed, equipment, etc.

- o Eligible 4-H member may request funds for supplies and equipment needed for participating in a pet or livestock project; however, funds are not available for the purchase of pets or livestock.
- o Grant funding cannot include meal expenses.
- o Items and supplies purchased from grant funding for 4-H project become the property of the eligible 4-H member.

o Liability, maintenance and warranty of the items and supplies purchased become the responsibility of the eligible 4-H member.

U of M offers online workshop: Understanding Teen Risk-Taking

Would you like to learn more about research on adolescent risk-taking and implications for your work? Register now for the workshop, "Understanding Adolescent Risk-Taking Behavior-Online Research Update for Professionals," developed by University of Minnesota Extension. This is the final time this topic will be offered as an online research update.

This short term professional development opportunity is designated to: define risk-taking, present a multi-dimensional framework for understanding risk-taking, introduce a model of adolescent decision making, reframe risk-taking, and offer a systems approach to risk-taking with an emphasis on family influences. Participants will have opportunities to apply current research on risk-taking through online activities and in threaded discussions. Participants will also be encouraged to discuss topics with other colleages.

The workshop is geared to professionals who work in schools, extension, court systems, treatment programs, faith based organizations, and public health; also counselors, social workers, youth workers, parent educators, prevention specialists, and others who work with teens and thier families in community organizations and agencies.

Registration is open from now until March 15, 2011. The workshop is accessible from the time registration confirmation is received through June 1, 2011. Participants can go in and out of the online workshop as many times as they wish, completing it at their own pace. An opportunity to connect with instructors and participants will be offered via a webinar on April 12, 2:00pm, CST. 2011 Camp Payment Process

Administrators have agreed on the following for 2011 Camp payments: **KSRE Rock Springs Camp Payment**

- 1. Individual extension units will pay Rock Springs within two weeks prior to the start of camp.
- 2. By February 1, the camp chair will submit to Rock Spring a list of extension units and whether to invoice the 4-H Council or Extension Council.
- 3. Two weeks prior to camp, the camp chair notifies the assigned Rock Springs Administrator on Duty of individual extension units' numbers by campers, counselors and agents/adults. (Scenic County: 112 campers, 15 counselors, 4 agents/adults for counselor training and 12 additional agents/adults).Plus, provide Rock Springs with the number of campers housed in the Stonybrook living area.
- 4. Upon receiving the number of campers by extension unit from the camp chair, Rock Springs will invoice individual extension units within the camp group.
- 5. Rock Springs will adjust for available discounts based on camper numbers and Stonybrook campers.
- 6. During 4-H camp, financial changes will be adjusted as needed. Additional fees must be submitted within two weeks following camp participation.

Extension 4-H Camp Incidental Fees

Options:

- 1. Camp groups' financial account managed within either an extension unit's 4-H Council or Extension Council as a sub-account.
- 2. Extension unit manages the account under KSRE recommendations.
- 3. Preference of KSRE Administration would be individual agents/adult volunteers purchase needed supplies/equipment on personal account and submit expenses to camp group treasurer for reimbursement.

CHARACTERCOUNTS!

CHARACTER COUNTS! You Can Do It and It's Worth It

I previously talked about two third graders: Leon, who had serious anger-management issues, and Sam, an incorrigible bully. Both boys were disciplined repeatedly with no effect, and their teacher Shavonne concluded that character and life-skill development efforts would be a waste of time.

To be sure, changing entrenched character traits is definitely not easy or certain, but it's far from impossible. You can change a person's behavior if you change his beliefs. Specifically, the task is to instill two specific beliefs: 1) "You can do it," and 2) "It's worth it."* Take Leon's anger management as an example. We can change his behavior if we convince him that he can resist his negative impulses if he really wants to, and that whatever work it would take to develop greater self control is worth it because his current life and future prospects would be so much better. First, we'd prove to him he can do it by reminding him of all the times he has done it. We could give him examples of others just like him who have done it, and we could teach him impulse control strategies (like counting to 10 before reacting) and praise him whenever he uses them. Next, we need to convince him that his life would improve greatly. We could discuss all the bad things that happen when he loses control and all the good things that can happen when he doesn't. We could show him how his opportunities increase and his relationships improve. The point is that change is always possible. So our message to teachers like Shavonne is: you can do it and it's worth it. [* The formulation "I can do it and it's worth it" comes from Influencer: The Power to Change Anything, an excellent book on change by a quintet of business consultants: Kerry Patterson, Joseph Grenny, David Maxfield, Ron McMillan, and Al Switzler. Another outstanding book is Switch by Dan and Chip Heath.] (Josephson, Michael. February 20, 2011) Gerhard
