Update on 4-H Tax Exempt Status and the IRS

All chartered 4-H clubs and qualified affiliate groups earning less than \$25,000 will not be penalized for not filing an ePostcard in 2008. [Those earning more than \$25,000 will continue to be subject to the 990 requirements for filing]. We anticipate having more details from the IRS when the IRS has completed processing the database. NEW ---- All Kansas chartered 4-H clubs and qualified affiliated groups that are subsidiaries under GEN 2704 should be contacting Jim Adams (jadams@ksu.edu) with your tax exempt issues. Do not contact National 4-H Headquarters or the IRS.

Please destroy the 1993 4-H Tax Exempt Guidance booklet (or previous versions) and the "Kirby" letter dated from 1973 as they are no longer valid.

IRS Encountering Delays in Processing Lists: In March 2008, National 4-H Headquarters forwarded to the IRS the listings they had received from states, of all authorized 4-H entities in Kansas programs. The IRS has encountered delays in completing the processing of our lists because:

- 1) There are far more entities requesting inclusion as subsidiaries than the IRS anticipated;
- 2) there continue to be significant errors with Employee Identification Numbers (EIN) listed for thousands of the 4-H entities certified;
- 3) the IRS is questioning the inclusion of some affiliated organizations which typically are considered independent organizations rather than program groups; and
- 4) there are questions on both the part of the IRS and National 4-H Headquarters regarding which requirements apply to 4-H, given that 4-H is a unique entity unlike any other organization.

Clarification of 4-H Tax Exempt Status:

We anticipate further delays with the existing data set. Since our current ruling dates back to the 1970's and was based on a 1946 ruling that referenced the Internal Revenue Code of 1939, National 4-H Headquarters has requested a new ruling from the IRS. Our unique status has caused much confusion in our system as volunteers and

others mistakenly assume that either 4-H is a 501(c)3 organization or it's just a governmental entity. Neither of these is true from an IRS perspective, thus some 4-H subsidiaries are not compliant with IRS expectations for our group. We anticipate that the Cooperative Extension System will continue to be subject to requirements to

certify the lists of subsidiaries, and that all subsidiaries will be required to electronically file, however, 4-H entities may not be subject to other requirements of 501(c)3 entities.

Again, National 4-H Headquarters has negotiated with the IRS that there will be no penalties for 4-H subsidiaries earning less than \$25,000 who do not electronically file for the remainder of 2008.

We thank all counties and volunteers as we transition to meet the IRS' requirements and increased accountability at the national and state levels for those authorized groups under Cooperative Extension raising money in the name of 4-H. We appreciate that clear guidance is critical in managing your 4-H Youth Development Program, and we will provide additional information as soon as we can. Thank you. Adams

- 2) Strengthening the 4-H club by establishing and enhancing club by-laws which clearly define expectation of members and parallel the *Kansas 4-H Youth Development Policies*.
- 3) Post the Member in Good Standing tools on the Kansas 4-H Web Site for Extension Units interested in establishing Member in Good Standing requirements.

Team America Rocketry Challenge

Registration Opens

As school doors swing open, students have a terrific opportunity to look forward to -- the Team America Rocketry Challenge. Registration is now open for the world's largest rocket contest challenging participants to compete for \$60.000 in prizes and scholarships and a trip to next year's international air show in Paris. The contest rules and registration are at www.rocketcontest.org. Participants must design and build a rocket that will climb to 750 feet and stay aloft for 45 seconds. This year's new task is transporting the one-egg payload lying on its side rather than positioned vertically, mimicking the position of an astronaut. Teams have until Dec.1 to register. April 6 is the deadline to conduct a qualifying launch and earn a trip to the finals, scheduled for May 16 at the Great Meadow in The Plains, Va. The registration fee is \$105. AIA sponsors the contest with the National Association of Rocketry. NASA, the Defense Department, the American Association of Physics Teachers and AIA member companies. Students in grades 7-12 in any U.S. school or non-profit youth organization are eligible to compete. About 7,000 students from across the country took part in the contest last year, and since TARC's first contest in 2003, almost 50,000 students have taken the challenge. A team from Enloe High School in North Carolina was crowned champion in 2008. The contest gives future engineers the opportunity to demonstrate their math and physics skills. Working together in a team environment, they will design a real aerospace product, which will be put through the rigors of testing and evaluation. The aerospace industry is actively looking for young people to join its ranks. The industry is facing a potential workforce crisis as scores of employees reach retirement age. According to AIA statistics, almost 60 percent of the U.S. aerospace workforce was age 45 or older in 2007. Counties/Districts Needed for 2009 4-H Japanese Exchange Program

It is not too late to participate as a host Extension Unit for the 2009 Japanese Exchange. Based on the county/district responses, Kansas has committed to hosting a specific number of youth and adult chaperones for the 2009 summer inbound program. We know this is a bit hard to plan ahead so many months in advance.

The Japanese will arrive in counties about July 20, 2009, and stay with one family each for around 3 ½ weeks. 2009 Kansas 4-H International Exchange Opportunities

4-H members between ages 14-19 have exciting 4-H International Exchange opportunities to choose from in 2009. 4-H groups will travel to **Australia, Finland, Japan, Costa Rica and Mexico** under management of the States' 4-H International Exchange and Wisconsin 4-H from participating states. All groups will have chaperones and include home stays arranged by 4-H's partner organizations in the host countries. Most run a month from mid June to mid July. Japan includes a longer program option that includes a class on Japanese language and culture while staying with a Tokyo family preceding the four-week home stay beginning mid July.

For any of these trips, applications are due November 3, 2008. One application may be used to apply for all trips in which a member has interest. He or she may decide at the time of interviews which destination is preferred. Late applications, with prior notification to Mary Kay Munson will be accepted until November 30, 2008. Required interviews and the first orientation will be December 5-6, 2008, in Manhattan. A deposit of \$175.00 is due at the time of application. Chaperones are needed for these groups, and these applications will be accepted until the first of the year. Selections of chaperones are made at the States' 4-H International Exchange level and supervise the whole U.S. delegation. Older youth and young adults can share their 4-H experience with rural youth in other countries as IFYE Representatives. 4-H alumni between 19 and 25 in summer 2009 have the opportunity to choose individual international exchanges to a wide variety of countries where Kansas 4-H has 4-H or rural youth organization partners. International 4-H Youth Exchange (IFYE) experiences can be arranged in Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America or the South Pacific for six weeks to six months. All include multiple home stays in rural areas or on farms. Some provide an opportunity to help strengthen 4-H in the host country. Country placements are tailored to each person based on availability of partner organizations, interests of the U.S. delegate, and the compatibility of the delegate's interests and skills with the host
