Highlights:	Kansas 4-H County or District 4-H Ambassadors and/or those wish to become one, will learn the leadership, marketing and communication skills needed to help promote 4-H in their County or District. Local Extension offices may not be able to provide chaperones and/or transportation to this training. Check with your local Extension Office before registering. Who Should Register:	Youth participants should be County or District 4-H Ambassadors or prospective Ambassadors and must be in the 8 th -12 th grades. Adult Ambassador Advisors, Chaperones and Extension Staff must also register.
Chaperones:	All youth delegates must have a designated, KSRE volunteer screened adult chaperone. County/District delegations may work together and share chaperones. Chaperones may be responsible for a maximum of 10 delegates. Adult chaperones must be at least 21 years of age. Adult chaperones must be on site full-time; they may not come-and-go.
Registration:	Registration is open on-line through February 10, 2019, 11:59 p.m., at: http://www.kansas4-h.org/events/index.html . Payment is due to your local Extension office by the local deadline. The Kansas 4-H Participation form will be completed on-line during the registration process. If the event you cannot register yourself on-line, please contact your local Extension office.
Cost:	\$115.00 fee includes meals and lodging at Rock Springs 4-H Center, snacks and all program costs. Delegates should pay fees to their local Extension Office. There is a \$25.00 cancellation fee through February 10 th . No refunds will be given beginning February 11 th , and the full registration fee will be collected. Checks should be made payable to the Kansas 4-H Foundation.
Attire:	The training will be held at Rock Springs 4-H Center, so dress appropriately. Remember, the Kansas 4-H Dress Code will be in place. Please keep this in mind as you pack for the workshop.
Etiquette:	Participants will be representing themselves, Kansas 4-H, and all youth in general. We expect they will model the six pillars of Character, Trustworthiness, Responsibility, Respect, Fairness, Caring and Citizenship.
