Observe the soil types key plants grow in and gain an understanding of weather that impacts their growth.

The ATV Safety Rider Course provides a fast-paced hands-on ATV session that includes pre-ride inspection, starting and stopping, quick turns, hill riding, emergency stopping and swerving, riding over obstacles, and more. You will be provided with a loaner ATV, helmet, goggles, and gloves. Personal goggles, gloves, and DOT or SNELL-rated helmets may be used. You will need to wear a long-sleeved shirt or jacket, long pants, and over-the-ankle boots. There will be some online instruction that needs to be completed prior to class.

## **Chopped Food Challenge - \$15 Fee**

If you have ever wanted to be a Food Network star, this is the class for you! Teams of 4-H members will create a dish using only a predetermined set of ingredients. From these ingredients, team members must identify and prepare the dish, then make a presentation about it to the judges.

## **Chuckwagon Cooking - \$25 Fee**

Have you ever watched the original "The Cowboys" movie with John Wayne and wondered what it would be like to live and work on a cattle drive? This 3-hour course is designed to give participants a general idea how cowboys lived and ate while herding cattle from Texas to Kansas. Is working in the Health fields your calling? Maybe you are going to be a babysitter or work with young children this summer. Youth can learn about and become **<u>CERTIFIED</u>** in CPR/First Aide. Also learn to properly use an AED defibrillator etc.

#### **Relationship & Interpersonal Skills Education (RISE) Youth Leaders**

#### Min – 3 Max – 25

In this session, RISE Youth Leaders will learn essential skills to promote mental health and healthy relationships in teens through interactive, hands-on activities. They will get to engage in various scenarios where they will learn how we can address the same issue from a prevention and an intervention lens. They will also learn about different careers that promote mental health and relationship well-being, including relationship education and couple and family therapy, tour the family center, and participate in a mock therapy session.

#### **Repro Nerd Herd - \$10 Fee**



During this session you will learn about reproductive anatomy and physiology, using the bovine as a model. This session will be composed of a couple of powerpoint presentations on anatomy and physiology of the reproductive system, as well as the biotechnologies available and used in the cattle industry. Furthermore, and perhaps more importantly, this session holds a hands-on component, where you will have the opportunity to interact with real reproductive tracts from cows, observe pregnancy diagnosis performed by ultrasonography, and many other activities related to reproduction. #### Wetland Wonders

#### Min – 5 Max - 20

Wetlands in Kansas? Kansas is home to the largest wetland in the United States - Cheyenne Bottoms. Explore how wetlands are productive ecosystems by comparing samples of plants, animals, soil, and water taken from Cheyenne Bottoms with samples found on campus. Participants will actually get in the water of Campus Creek to test water samples and collect aquatic invertebrates.
