## INTERNATIONAL 4-H YOUTH EXCHANGE TRAVEL with the IFYE REPRESENTATIVE Program

**Who:** 19 - 25 year old 4-H alumni and others interested in living and working with host families in other countries.

**What:** Most exchanges are six-month or three-month in length. It may be possible to negotiate a shorter time period. Representatives live and work with two or more host families for varying periods, usually two to three weeks at a time. Representatives have the opportunity and are expected to participate in day-to-day family life. In addition, Representatives interact with the host organizations, which are similar to 4-H. Representatives may pursue special interests through self-study, and many arrange for academic credit through their universities.

**When:** Representatives to most countries leave in mid-June and return in mid-September or early-December.

*Where:* Countries in all areas of the world: Western Europe, Eastern Europe, Latin America, Australia, Asia, and Africa have potential participating countries.

*Why:* International 4-H Youth Exchange programs enhance world citizenship skills and the 4-H program through international, cross-cultural and global education experiences that enable young people to improve their leadership and communication skills, while increasing their international awareness and understanding.

**Program Fee:** The IFYE program fee may be from \$2,500 to \$3,500, depending on the destination area of the world. The fee includes international airline ticket, travel in host country, food, lodging, supplemental insurance, and orientation and evaluation programs and expenses for hosting a counterpart in Kansas. Partial scholarships and fund raising assistance is available through IFYE Associations and some county Extension programs. Applications are due November 1 annually.
