Joe Wolter Clinic

Any 4-H horse project members/groups (no more than 2 adults) are welcome to come and watch this clinic for free. They are waiving the \$30 spectator fee for 4-H'ers. If you or your group would like to attend, please pre-register with Justin Waggoner by June 21st.

Just as no two horses or people are alike, no two Joe Wolter Clinics are alike. Joe is an innovative teacher, always adjusting to fit the situation and to meet the needs of riders and their horses.

Riders of all levels and disciplines are welcome. It doesn't matter what sort of saddle you ride, or who made it. You can wear a hard hat, a flat hat, or a ball cap. All that really matters is your desire to learn.

Horsemanship

Horsemanship classes serve as the foundation for advancement and are designed to help develop a stronger horse/human

partnership regardless of the rider's discipline or experience.


Horsemanship 1 is ideal for green riders, green horses, more advanced riders wishing to build additional skills or older horses that might benefit from more foundation work. Joe works with each horse and rider to help them progress as a team and to address any issues they may encounter. The class covers basic groundwork in preparation for riding, and then continues those lessons into the saddle for further progression of horse and rider.

Horsemanship 2 focuses on refining the skills needed to further advance riders toward their goals, whether on a ranch, on the trail, or in the show ring. Joe strives to help riders understand things from the horse's point of view so that together they can accomplish whatever is required of them. The class is geared to the individual needs of each horse and rider and may include cow work, trail obstacles or other challenges.

Colt Starting

This class is for horses that haven't yet been ridden or may have been ridden, but are still very green or have some problems that might be helped by restarting with a different approach. While Joe may work with each horse individually, the intent is to help every rider prepare their horse and ride it themselves for the first time. Joe's ultimate goal is for each horse to be moving freely with a rider so that they leave the clinic with a solid foundation on which to continue further training.

2019 American Quarter Horse Hall of Fame Inductee – Kansas' Own, Billy Allen

As a youngster growing up on a farm with cattle and work horses, Billy Allen had a dream of becoming a world champion roper. However, after competing in rodeos, he decided in his mid-twenties that training horses professionally would be a more rewarding career. From that point his success as a trainer and involvement in the Quarter Horse industry has been almost legendary.

Billy trained and showed 11 World Champions and many Honor Roll horses including Zan Parr Bar, Zan Gold Jack, Zippen Zanita and The Highfalutin Dude. In fact, in 1976 Allen campaigned three different horses to win high point titles in reining, calf roping and team roping. While descendants of Harlan, Tyree and Two Eyed Jack have been prominent in his training program, Allen believes his best known student is probably Zan Par Bar. One of the reasons Allen has been so successful as a trainer is no doubt due to his philosophy that you need to break the horse, then let him tell you what he wants to do. Allen also believes that good horses make good trainers.

In addition to training Allen is also known for standing several top stallions at his Scott City ranch and the creation of some well-known products too. A number of years ago when Allen tired of searching for a good performance feed, he developed his own. Currently 250 to 300 tons of his feed is sold every month to customers in many states. Besides feed, he also created a popular bit mouth piece that bears his name and is a staple with most horsemen.

Allen is also a well-known figure in both the American Quarter Horse Association and the Kansas Quarter Horse Association. A longtime member of both organizations, he has served as a member of the KQHA Board of Directors and is a past president of the association. On the national level, he has served on the judges committee

selecting new judges to officiate at AQHA approved shows. In addition, he has helped at numerous clinics for youth and amateurs. He is also an AQHA judge whose assignments have included all major livestock shows, the Quarter Horse Congress, the AQHA World Championship Show, and the AQHA World Championship Show, and the European Championships. An interesting side note is that the Allen family has contributed three AQHA judges as Billy's sons Doug and Jeff are also approved judges.

We thank Mr. Allen, for his contributions to the horse world.
