A. PREPARING LOCAL EXTENSION UNIT PROJECT WINNERS FOR REGIONAL EVALUATION

Each Extension Unit is responsible for getting their member's documents to the regional screening. If an Extension Unit sends local winners to regionals, they should also send 1-3 adults per county represented to judge.

- 1. Please refer to the <u>Guide to Kansas 4-H Project Recognition</u> that will help your young people prepare their project cover letter(s) and project resume(s).
- Each local Extension Unit is allowed to send one local project winner per project award
 category. Extension Districts may submit one local project winner equal to the number of
 counties comprising the district. Each 4-H'er must submit a separate folder of documents for
 each project award category they are eligible. Refer to Regional Project Award Judging –
 Attachment 1 for a list of project award categories.
- 3. All submitted project award documents MUST use the current version of the Kansas 4-H Project Report Forms, dated 2020/2021. Any awards submitted on KAP's or Local will NOT be evaluated at Regional or State levels.
- 4. It is extremely important that your 4-H'ers have a copy of the Project Report Form Evaluation Rubric as well as the Cover Letter & Resume Evaluation Rubric as they begin to prepare for regional and state judging.
- 5. Be sure to make a copy of a complete Project Award submission before taking it to Regional Evaluation
- 6. 4-H'ers with only one year in the project ARE eligible for Regional evaluation.

Age Information

- a) 4-H'ers must have passed their 14th birthday BEFORE January 1, 2023
- b) 4-H'ers who have turned 19 years of age prior to January 1, 2023 may be selected as a State Project Award winner, as long as they were an enrolled member for the project work submitted.
- c) If selected as a State Project Award winner, 4-H'ers who have turned 19 years of age prior to January 1, 2023 will NOT be eligible to attend National 4-H Congress.
- d) Eligible birth years for competing at the 2023 Regional/State 4-H Project Award evaluations are 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008.
- e) Please double check applicant's age. DO NOT send any applications that do not meet these age guidelines.

Assembling the 4-H Project Award

The following items must be turned in for a complete Regional Project Award submission:

- Check Sheet
- 2. Personal Information Page
- 3. Project Report Form
- 4. Cover Letter
- 5. Resume

Please do not include:

- 4-H Permanent Records
- Plastic page sleeves

B. REGIONAL PROJECT AWARD EVALUATION PROCEDURES

The following operational procedures will be followed in each Region:

- 1. Each Extension Unit may send a maximum of 3 people (paid or volunteer staff) to judge times the number of counties that comprise the unit. No judge shall evaluate their own child's submission. Volunteers will not judge their own club or action team members. Teams of evaluators should consist of representatives from different Extension units. Evaluation teams may need to evaluate a submission from their own Extension unit, however, it cannot be their own child's, or their club member.
- 2. Evaluators should have previous training and/or experience with evaluating award applications. It is recommended that the same volunteers should not return to judge after two consecutive years. A brief orientation for all judges will be conducted before the evaluation begins.
- 3. Teams of two evaluators, each representing different Extension units, will be assigned by Regional Specialist facilitating the judging process. The official Evaluation Rubrics will be used for scoring. The Evaluation Forms will be completed for at least the top 2 submissions in an award program area. More may be scored if desired. Completed evaluation forms are confidential and should be seen only by the evaluation team and the staff person conducting the screening. If the decision of the evaluation team is that the project award submission does not meet standards, another team will verify. If the second team indicates the submission does meet standards, a third team will determine the outcome. The top two Project Award submissions will be posted at the end of the judging.
- 4. Only the top two in each award category will represent the region at state judging. At state judging, regional rankings are not considered. Written feedback form will be completed for each project submitted and returned inside the folder/binder.

C. STATE PROJECT AWARD EVALUATION PROCEDURES

- 1. If a Project Award is selected to advance to the state level, the documents and video are due no later than Wednesday, March 1, 2023.
- 2. Youth will submit each project award as ONE PDF Document, including the Personal Information Page, Cover Letter, Resume & Project Report Form. The file name should be formatted: projectarea_lastname_firstname. Example: Photography Sollock Amy
- 3. Each State finalist will also submit a five-minute project award video. Please see <u>4-H Project</u> Award Video Instructions for more details.
- 4. Youth will submit their document(s) and video(s) using the following link no later than Wednesday, March 1, 2023: 2023 Kansas 4-H State Project Award Submission

D. SELECTION OF STATE WINNERS AND DELEGATES TO NATIONAL 4-H CONGRESS

- State project award winners in each project category may be eligible to attend the 2023
 National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia, given that they meet the age requirements to attend.
- 2. Past State Winners may apply for an award for which they have not already been named a state winner.
- 3. Youth are only eligible to take the trip to National 4-H Congress once.
- 4. If youth are named a state winner in a second area, they may receive recognition, but the National 4-H Congress opportunity will be offered to an alternate.
- 5. The Kansas delegation to Congress consists of 80% peer competition and 20% from two other tracks.
 - a) A random drawing from recipients of the prestigious Kansas 4-H Key Award to represent our state as Standard of Excellence Delegates. Extension units will nominate Key Award recipients and seven youth will be randomly selected to attend National 4-H Congress.
 - b) Each Extension Unit may select one Centennial Delegate attend National 4-H Congress using locally determined criteria

E. STATE AWARD EVALUATORS

Purpose: To contribute to the selection process of the State Project Award winners.

Locations: Remote. Project Award Submissions are evaluated electronically.

Requirements: Evaluators will sign a confidentially statement and receive additional information on how to score the Project Awards. Each project area will have 3 evaluators. An aggregate score will determine winners for the Project Area.

Skills and Knowledge and Requirements:

- Previous experience of evaluating 4-H awards
- Ability to be fair and objective
- Access to reliable internet and technology

KSRE-4-H Department Provides:

- Notification to selected 4-H scholarship evaluators
- An orientation for evaluating 4-H project awards
- Timeline for evaluation
- Answer questions regarding process or applications.
